TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Isaiah 56:1, 6-7 A Place of Welcome

People different from us can really make us uncomfortable. It is like we do not share the same language or rely on the same experiences. We have different circles of friends and different sources of trust. For many of us, the best way to deal with people different from us is to avoid them.

Tolerance is good, but sometimes even tolerance masks prejudice. We tolerate those who are different as long as they act like we do. If they observe our customs, do not hang out in packs of their own kind, and visit our places with respect, we may accept them.

More challenging is to let those who are different from us change our own way of thinking—to let them open our minds to other possibilities and allow us to grow.

God spoke a message of openness through the mouth of the prophet Isaiah. The God known as the originator of the covenant with the Israelites, the God who made them a special possession, offers a different view in this prophecy. God will bring foreigners to the holy mountain and make them joyful in its place of prayer. "My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples."

Is your place of worship a place of welcome for those who are different?

SAINT JOSEPH UNIVERSITY PARISH AUGUST 27, 7:00PM



On Sunday, August 27, at 7:00pm, St. Joseph's University Parish in Terre Haute will celebrate the Gold Mass of the Holy Spirit together with university faculty and students, as well as with scholars and scientists of every kind. This tradition goes back to the University of Paris in the Middle Ages, where especially the Franciscans and Dominicans wanted to recognize, honor, and bless those engaged in study and learning. St. Albert the Great of the Dominican Order became their example – even as a priest and preacher, he insisted on continuing his research in chemistry, mathematics, and linguistics (especially Arabic). It is called the Gold Mass because the Dean of the

University of Paris wore a golden hood and sash. In Terre Haute, we want to continue the tradition! Friar Tony Vattaparambil, OFM Conv. will lead us in a votive Mass for the start of the academic year. We extend a special invitation to everyone involved in education and research.

Stained glass windows as we know them today were not developed until the 10th century.

It was during the medieval period that stained glass windows became a primary way to teach the illiterate laity the many stories of the Bible. Often these windows, depending on the size of the church, would go from Genesis to Revelation, highlighting the most important stories in Salvation History.



The history of the Bible depicted in these windows would also be connected to a brief representation of Church history. Saints were also shown in these windows and presented as a daily inspiration for the people struggling on their Christian journey. The windows were also used to illustrate the illumination of the mind with divine knowledge and how grace penetrates our world.

Sister Adele was a native of Toronto, Canada. Before her passing, she ministered in prayer at Saint Mary-of-the-Woods.

Sister Adele, formerly Sister Joseph Therese, entered the Congregation on July 22,

1946. She professed final vows on January 23, 1954.

She graduated from Saint Mary-of-the-Woods College with a bachelor's degree in education. She also had a master's degree in reading from Cardinal Stritch University, as well as another master's degree in theological studies from St. Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology.

She ministered as a teacher and in religious education in Indiana and Illinois. Sr. Adele was the Director of Religious Education at Sacred Heart during the 1990s.

Sr. Adele joined the heavenly host on Monday, Aug. 7, 2023.
