2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16
A DREAM COME TRUE

Perhaps you have hoped for something that has never come to pass. All your life you had your heart fixed on one desire, but it has eluded your grasp. Perhaps you feel anger and take it out on people you love. Perhaps you have accepted this unrealized dream as a part of the life God calls you to live.

The woman who offers hospitality to Elisha had such a dream. She wanted a child. But her husband was aging, and it appeared that her one desire would never come.

The story, in the Second Book of Kings, indicates that she was a woman of influence. She may have had wealth and respect in her community, but she was unable to have the blessing she most wanted. All we know of her is her reputation for hospitality. She was remembered not for her misery, not for her disappointment, but for opening her home to a traveling prophet.

In the story's happy ending, she receives the desire of her heart. But throughout, she is a model for those who hope for something good. She never gave up trusting in God. She practiced the one virtue she would need if her dream would ever be fulfilled: hospitality.

Did You Know?

Have you ever heard the term, "Catholic calisthenics"? It's a funny term used to describe all of the actions and postures we Catholics perform in the context of the Catholic Mass. Non-Catholics who join us at Mass can be confused (sometimes overwhelmed!) by all of our activity without knowing its purpose and, as Catholics, we can run into the problem of performing these actions in a robotic sort of way without giving much thought to what we are doing. In the first of several parts, we'll look at each of these actions and postures to get a deeper understanding of why we do them.

First, let's consider the reason for performing any action at all. We humans are both body and spirit. Each of us has a soul, which ought to always strive to ascend to God, and we also possess corporeal bodies which exist in this world. We may try to compartmentalize these two aspects of who we are, but they are meant to be unified, so we should be mindful of how they affect each other. Thus, when we perform certain actions during prayer, we are praying with our whole and complete person and not just some part of it, like our thoughts or words alone. By performing the same actions in the context of the Mass, we create unity within the congregation that is currently at worship and unity among Catholics around the world who perform the same or similar actions at each and every Mass. Remember, we are all the members that make up the body of Christ and that body must be unified by the very definition of what it means to be a body.

Let's begin with the most common of our physical actions as Catholics (at Mass or anywhere else): the Sign of the Cross. When we make the Sign of the Cross, we are physically declaring our belief in the Holy Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. You can see very clearly here that we reflect what we believe in our physical bodies, unifying our body and soul. We are physically declaring the Truth that the Trinity exists and that Jesus' love for us was manifested on a physical cross, which is at the very heart of our faith. We are also making this truth visible to anyone who can see us. For example, it is one thing to pray before a meal at a restaurant, it is another thing to do so by beginning and ending that prayer with the Sign of the Cross for all to see. By declaring our beliefs with our bodies, we become visible signs of Christianity to the world. In the context of the Mass, the first time we make the Sign of the Cross is when we enter the Church and dip our fingers into a holy water font. This specifically reminds us of our baptism and the gifts we received from that sacrament.

We, the Carmelite nuns, are happy to welcome you to join us for the public novena in honor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This year, Father Bob Showers, OFM Conv., pastor of St. Joseph's and St. Benedict's in Terre Haute, will preach the novena. He will be with us every night except July 14, when Father Todd Riebe will take his place. It will be a wonderful chance to enrich your spiritual life with inspiring and motivating reflections.

The novena will be held at the Carmelite Monastery, 59 Allendale, from July 8th to the 16th, the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available from 6pm to 7pm. The actual novena service begins each evening at 7pm, with the recitation of the rosary and the novena prayer, followed by Holy Mass.
