#### <u>FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME</u> Isaiah 55:10-11 LIFE-GIVING WORD

We cannot live without water. Rain has a job to do. It comes from the heavens and waters the earth. The earth then brings forth seed for crops and enables the baking of bread and the preparation of essential foods. Water returns to the sky, the prophet Isaiah says, but only after it has done its job.

We cannot live without the word of God. It has a job to do as well. It comes from the heavens to bring its fruitfulness to the earth. It announces God's love, provides direction for the wayward, and gives hope to those who despair. God's word returns to heaven, but not before it has done its job.

Sometimes we squander these gifts. Household plants may be inches away from water, but they will not grow unless we give them a drink. We may be inches away from God's word. It comes to us in the Scriptures, in the order of nature, in the counsel of friends, and in the community of believers. But we cannot grow unless we lift the cup and take a drink.

Where does God's word speak around you? What occasions do you have to listen? God's word has a job to do. Put it to work.



Mark your calendar now for our end of year celebration on June 8, 2024.



## Did You Know?

#### CATHOLIC CALISTHENICS PART 3

The custom of kneeling and bowing is inspired in part by the following words of St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians: "Therefore, God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Fa ther" (Phil 2:911). When we kneel and bow in unison, it reminds us that we come to God as one people united in our commitment of faith.

There are two different types of bows in the Catholic liturgy: A bow of the head is made when the three Divine Persons are named together, and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the saint in whose honor the Mass is being celebrated. This is a gesture of respect for the persons being named.

A profound bow at the waist is an expression of profound reverence. We make a profound bow, toward the altar, when we are reciting the Creed ("and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man"). This posture expresses our shared acknowledgement of the central Christian belief in the Incarnation – the fact that God loved his people so much that he became a human being and dwelt among us.

We also bow when we go forward to receive Holy Communion. The church asks that we express our reverence at this time with an outward symbol. In most cases, that is a bow of the head as one approaches the minister of the Eucharist to receive the Body and the Blood of Christ.

Kneeling is an outward sign of an inner attitude of humility, supplication, and gratitude to God. Kneeling on both knees is an expression of reverence for Jesus Christ who is truly present in the Eucharistic species. Together, we kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer – that central point during the Mass when the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. After we have proclaimed the *Sanctus* ("holy, holy, holy"), the faithful kneel and remain kneeling until after the Great Amen, except when prevented by ill health or for reasons of lack of space, or the large number of people present, or for another reasonable cause. On those occasions when the congregation is not able to kneel, we all stand during the Eucharistic Prayer. When the congregation is kneeling, and an individual is not capable of kneeling, that person may sit. However, those who are standing during the Eucharistic Prayer should make a profound bow when the priest genuflects after the consecration.

One Sunday when my children were particularly loud in church, I told Father McSween I was sorry they were so loud.

He said, "When you don't hear children in church, the church is dead."
